D., 1863 in the evening at 7 o clock. After singing, and prayer by Rev. David Winters, the opening sermon, according to appointment, was preached by the Rev. John W. Nevin, D. D., from 1 Cor. 1: 21-24. Thereupon, the Synod having been called to order, the Rev. Dr. J. W. Nevin was appointed President, pro tem., who opened the Synod with prayer. The Rev. Moses Kieffer, D. D., was chosen Secretary, pro tem. But before proceeding further in effecting an organization, the Synod adjourned until to-morrow morning at 9 o clock. Dismissed with a doxology, and the benediction by the President....
