Although a great deal has been effected in securing extended accomodation at the Portland Terminus--the most important feature in the whole project, there still remains much to be accomplished which is now in active operation. Hence expenditure upon a large scale is still going on, to stop which would be virtually to close the door upon the trade. I would estimate the work still to be done on the line, and the stations between Montreal and Portland, and the necessary increase at the Portland Terminus to be about 150, 000 sterhng.
